FALL MEETING: On **Sunday, Sept 8th** we held our fall member meeting at St Andrew's Episcopal Church. The meeting included the drawing for 2025 Featured Artists of the Month. Then after a short break, member and program guest Craig Wright presented an informative session on his giclee printing service and answered questions about how it works. Craig has posted some information on our website - on the main page, click 'Services offered by PVW members," where you'll see his name and a link to more information.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: The new Finance Committee is made up of Thom Lowther, Leigh Fulton, Kate Niner and Jeane Stetson, who is also the PVW Treasurer. PVW has hired Gadfly Ledgers, LLC to handle the bookkeeping, conduct our banking, and generate reports.

In a review of financial activity over the past few years, the committee determined that PVW is spending more than it is taking in. Due to inflation, increased costs in rent and supplies, and legitimate but unanticipated expenses, the balance of funds in the bank account has been steadily decreasing over the past few years.

The committee has been working with the program chairs to review the income and expenses associated with PVW events. This data will be used to create a budget for 2025. In the past, PVW has stepped in to subsidize events but can not afford to do so in the foreseeable future. And while PVW tries to keep costs to our members to a minimum, starting in 2025 program fees will need to cover all expenses involved with each event.

DUES: Dues for 2025 Membership Renewal will open for payment on January 1, 2025. Due to higher costs, our expenses have increased greatly so the PVW board regretfully eliminated the Fall Early Bird Discount of past years.



This year, PVW had another profitable exhibit, with \$12,325 in sales. And thanks to our ticket sellers at the door, the raffle brought in \$750.

Overall, 46 PVW artists participated in the exhibit and there were 345 visitors. There were 46 artists in the show displaying approximately 265 framed paintings and about 500 shrink-wrapped paintings. There were approximately 60 tabletop paintings. 67% of our artists sold at least one item. We sold a total of 131 items which included 58 packs of cards. People loved those cards!


