As a teacher, the fall always seems like the beginning of the new year to me. Even as the president of PVW, September is the beginning of the planning period for the club's activi-



ties for the upcoming year. I am always excited this time of year for a new beginning and for what is to come. I hope you are too.

The PVW board is hard at work trying to line up art shows, paint outs, travel trips and workshops. I'd like to mention a few things about each one of these activities.

Shows: We try to find venues for shows that are in different areas since we have members in Virginia, Maryland and DC. Sometimes shows will be closer to your home than others. We still want all of you to participate. Remember, artwork doesn't sell when it's in your closet. Get your work out there to be seen by that unsuspecting art collector. There are times when drop off dates aren't convenient or take down dates are when you are out of town. We are a group that helps each other. Put out a call for someone to help you if you are in this situation. Also, if you are a show coordinator and something comes up, and you can't be there for receiving, please put out a call to the people in the show and ask if someone can fill in for you. We should all be willing to step up and help each other out. That's what makes PVW special.

Paint Outs: We have a great team that puts together ideas and dates of when and where to paint plein air. If you haven't gone out with this group, try to squeeze one in this year. They are fun! It's a lot to expect for our two

coordinators to be at every paint out, so when you do sign up to do one, mention that you would be willing to be the point person for that day in case our chairs can't be there that day. It's important to have someone that people can come to, check in with and coordinate a time to meet at the end to compare viewpoints. It doesn't take any preparation, but it's a way to contribute if our leaders can't be there. They will appreciate having a day off.

When the prospectus for the **Sandy Maudlin** workshop went out with the bold assertion that "painting with Yupo is a blast!" I'm sure it was met with no few eye rolls and "yeah, right"s. However, for the intrepid PVW members who took up the creative challenge for the week of October 15-19, the results were nothing short of stunning. Sandy's obvious confidence in her medium was infectious, and she guided students through her techniques with seemingly effortless demonstrations and well thought out explanations. From direct painting using watercolor to tape batik, and from poured fluid acrylics to "painting" with small squeegees and watercolor, each step was accompanied by clear direction and followed up with plenty of one-on-one advice and critique. It was a fun and rewarding workshop, and I suspect future PVW shows may feature a lot more Yupo!


Jane Angelhart, October 7-11, 2019



Pvwbulletinboard@googlegroups.com is an optional email group for all other art-related things you might want to share or read about: your own exhibits; opportunities to show; questions about technique; searching for, selling, or giving away art supplies and equipment – you name it. If you want to join this group or want guidance about posting, send an email to deborahconn@verizon.net. You can choose to receive emails as they are posted or once a day in a daily digest.

Important: when you reply to a Google groups email post whether from officialpyw or the pywbulletinboard – unless everyone in that group needs to see it, PLEASE simply hit "reply" to respond to the sender. **DO NOT** hit "reply all" or copy the group. Everyone's inboxes are swamped and we don't need to add unnecessarily. It never hurts to doublecheck that your PVW replies do not have either of these two email addresses in your send or "cc" lines.
