Please note changes from last year.

The deadline for renewing your membership is January 31, 2023.

The Active Membership "early bird" fee is \$35 on or before December 31st - but will increase to \$50.00 on January 1, 2023.

Inactive Membership is \$15.00. *Please see Section 4 under Article III of the bylaws to see the difference between Active and Inactive membership if you wish to change your status. The bylaws are available on the website.

1. ONLINE PAYMENTS:


Upcoming Workshops - 2023

Cityscapes; Pouring with Laurie Goldstein-Warren

Monday, March 27, 2023, to Friday, March 31, 2023, 9:30am-3:30pm daily

Laurie Goldstein Warren is known by reputation to most PVW members. Pouring is one of the techniques that has made her artwork internationally famous. Come meet her in person to learn or brush up on your masking and pouring skills. Warren employs a limited palette of watercolor and/or acrylic, generally just 3-4 colors, to create a variety of tones and values. Paintings are finished with texture tools and techniques including toothbrushes, mouth atomizers and more.

In this workshop, Laurie will be concentrating on Cityscapes but any subject benefits from the dynamic color and deep shadow created by pouring. Monday, October 16, to Friday, October 20, 2023, 9:30am-3:30pm daily

Richard Stephens was recommended to PVW by Robbie Laird as an artist consistently praised for his instruction, good nature, humor, and 5-star reviews from his students and art groups. Among his busy workshop schedule, Stephens also teaches at Kanuga Watermedia Workshops.

With a background in illustration and commercial art, Richard feels the real subjects of his paintings are his brushwork and the light he tries to capture and amplify through value contrast and an unexpected color palette. His approach to watercolor painting is loose and spontaneous. Richard has an international reputation for confident, loose impressionistic paintings in a variety of genre and holds signature status in several major watercolor societies. His works have won awards in numerous national competitions, appeared in the 2008, 2012, and 2018 editions of SPLASH, and been featured in Watercolor Artist and The Art of Watercolor.
